We hope you will enjoy learning about Ohlone Humane Society's (OHS) Pet Therapy Program by coloring pictures of the teams at work and at home. These are pictures that show what the animals and volunteers for OHS pet therapy do for the community. The dogs in the pictures have their real name, breed, and working sites, but these are simple drawings and not their real photos. Each therapy dog belongs to a family who loves them and has had special training to make sure their animal enjoys meeting new people and is safe with children. The families and pets have passed special tests to be around all kinds of people and places. At home, though, the animals are family pets and relax and play.

OHS Pet Therapy teams visit schools, senior living centers, schools, colleges, hospitals, clinics, counseling sessions, camps, and other places that are a good match for people and the therapy pets.

A favorite place for the dogs is visiting local libraries. The Read-to-a-Dog program helps children who are shy about reading aloud and anyone who would like to learn more about dogs. 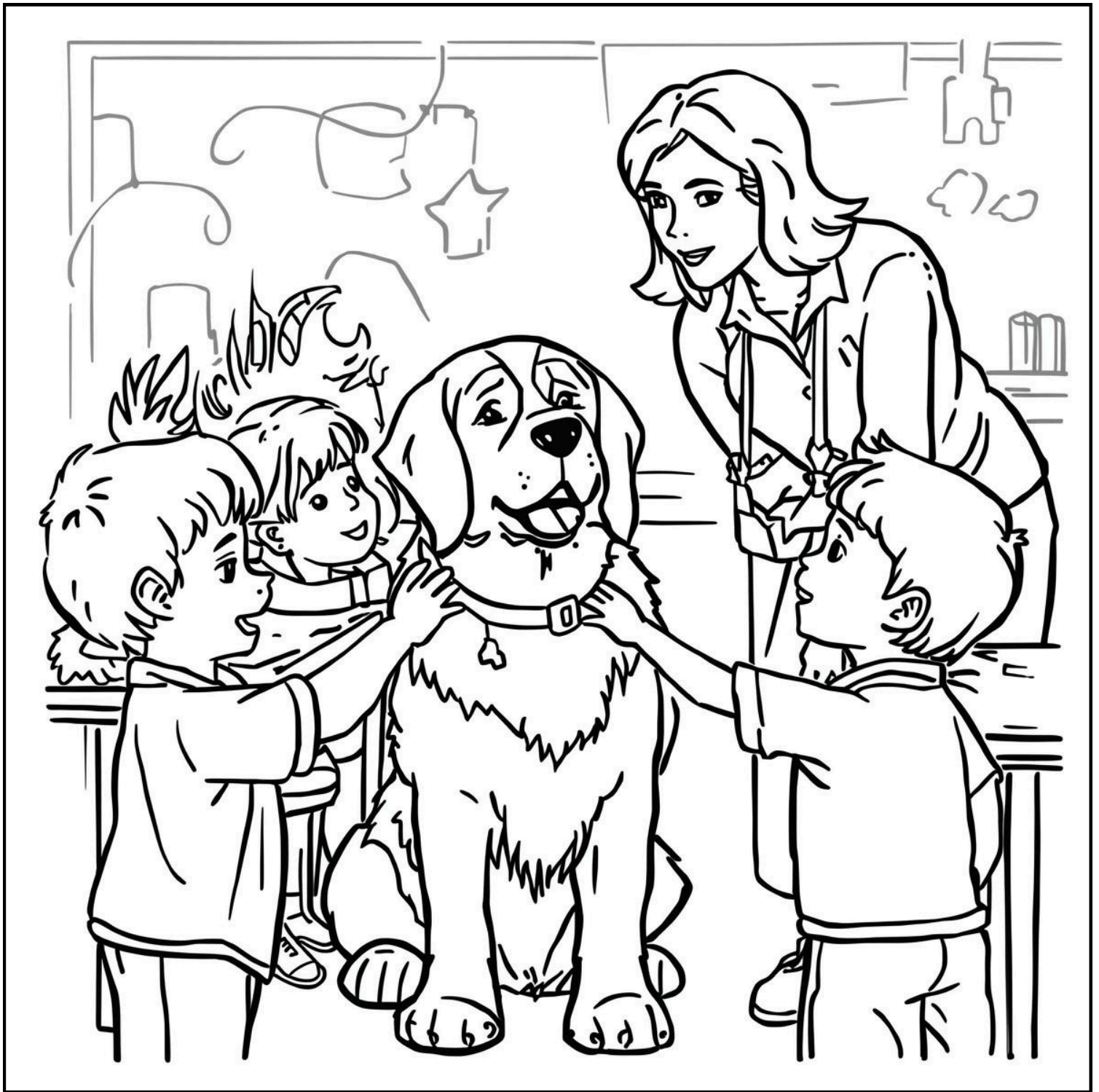
